

## INVENTORY OF THE MIMS-JONES CEMETERY, CASWELL COUNTY, N.C.

Located in Locust Hill Township on east side of State Road 1312 about a hundred yards northeast of house owned (in 1998) by Mrs. Pansy Foster. In early nineteenth century, the farm was known as the "John Mims Place." Mims's original house, in which Mrs. Foster lives, has been modernized. Cemetery inventoried by Dr. H. G. Jones on 25 December 1998.
