### CURRENT EVENTS

A twenty-five million dollar National Center for Environmental Sciences, long sought by North Carolina, will be built in the Chapel Hill - Raleigh-Durham Research Triangle Complex, Governor Terry Sanford announced on Wednesday, January 6, at his final press conference. The center is supposed to house 1,000 or more people. The center will be built on 400 acres of land, furnished free by the government. The major Center will be built in North Carolina; but Ohio and West Va. will share an expanded program of environmental health research. Preliminary plans for construction of new facilities at the Robert A. Taft Sanitary Engineering Center in Cincinnati and the Appalachian Center in Morgantown, West Virginia, are under way. Environmental health research activities now under way deal with air, water, radiation, milk, food, sanitation, public health aspects of the use of pesticides, occupational health, and environmental health sciences.
