He commanded as captain a privateor. Captured many British ships. Later taken prisoner on a prison ship, the Jersey, in Now York City. Later moved to Canandaigua when it was boasting of 4 log cabins. He was farmer and surveyor. His final move was to lower Sandusky Ohio, in 1814 now known as Fremont, Ohio. He was buried there with military honors.

Private in the Pennsylvania Milita.

Applied for pension, 1832 in circuit court of Warren County, Ohio.

Private "Now Jersey Men". Came to Ohio in 1787.

Private in Capt. William Skiles Company 1st. Battaliou Lancaster County Militia, May 1781. Private in Capt. William Skiles 4th Company 1st Battallon, Lancaster Courty Militia 1782. Ref: Columbiana County Records. Listed as a Revolutionery Spidier in Byron Williams "History of Clermont and Brown Counties, Ohic." Private in Moses McCleaus 6th Battalion.

Captain in 4th Regiment, Orange County, N.Y., Militia.

4th New York Regiment under Col. James Holmes.

Private in the Revolutionary War. Participated in several alarms in New York and Pennsylvania. Received 200 acres donation lands.

Enlisted Apr. 11, 1776. Name last appeared Apr. 21, 1778, in 2d Vacant Company in German regiment of Continental Porces commanded by Lt. Col. Ludwick Weltner.

Private in the war. Enlisted Apr. 16, 1781. Robertson's Rangers, Continental line, depreciation pay Northumberland County M.litia. Served 45 days. Pennsylvania Archives.

Present at surrender of Lord Cornwallis to Count Grasse, Sept. 28, 1781.

Ranger on the frontier 1778. Member of Capt. Charles A. Reed's company in the 4th Battallon. Washington County Militia. Ordered to rendezvous the first day of March 1782. First class. Served 5 years in Lee's Legion of Horse.

Virginia service in Shonardoah Valley, Va., in Revolution. Receive 1 land grant. Was member of Shenardoah Valley, Virginia, Baptist Church White House.

2d Class Private Thomas Perkinson's company of the militia in Battle of Washington County in Pennsylvania. Commanded by Col. Thomas Crooks. On the muster rolls, dated Oct. 2, 1781 and Mar. 25, 1782. "Pennsylvania Archives."
